WHEREAS, currently pending in Federal District Courts for the Northern and Southern Districts of Ohio are two class action lawsuits filed by residents challenging the constitutionality of a municipalities' point of sale and property maintenance inspection requirements; and

WHEREAS, while the lawsuits are pending and until the Ohio General Assembly provides guidance to municipalities with regard to point of sale and property maintenance inspections, the Mayor believes that it is prudent for a temporary moratorium be placed on the enforcement of Section 1494.07.

WHEREAS, the Maple Heights Service Director and City Engineer have informed the Mayor that the City of Maple Heights needs to perform work in order to maintain compliance with the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (OEPA) and the Small MS4 (Municipal Separate Storm Water System) permit; and

WHEREAS, the City of Maple Heights is currently operating under the Ohio EPA's National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Storm Water General Permit Coverage (Small MS4 General Permit) which gives authorization to discharge to the surface waters of Ohio; and

WHEREAS, the Ohio EPA's (NPDES) Storm Water General Permit for a Small MS4 requires the City of Maple Heights to provide effective storm water management by using a holistic system management approach known as Best Management Practices (BMPs); and

WHEREAS, the Ohio EPA's BMPs encourage Pollution Prevention and Good Housekeeping at all municipal facilities including, but not limited to, service facilities, maintenance areas, storage yards, waste transfer stations and salt storage areas; and

WHEREAS, municipal activities such as waste collection and street sweeping require proper containment of materials to ensure no pollutants are released into MS4s that ultimately discharge to the surface waters of Ohio; and

WHEREAS, the Northeast Ohio Regional Sewer District (NEORSD) provides funding to Member Communities, including the City of Maple Heights, for community specific storm water management projects under the Community Cost-Share Program; and

WHEREAS, the City Engineer and the Service Director have been informed by the NEORSD that the proper containment of solid waste and street sweepings would effectively serve as a Pollution Prevention and Good Housekeeping BMP and thus qualify as a storm water management project eligible for Community Cost-Share Program funds; and

WHEREAS, the City Engineer and the Service Director were successful in their application to the NEORSD for the disbursement of Community Cost-Share Program funds associated with solid waste handling, storage yard maintenance, non-authorized storm water discharge assessment and OEPA MS4 storm water permit requirements (2019 MS4 Storm water Management) work in the amount up to One Hundred Thirty Five Thousand Dollars (\$135,000.00), which includes the containment of solid waste and street sweeping material; and

WHEREAS, the City Engineer sought nine (9) price proposals and received two (2) price proposals for the containment of street sweepings and miscellaneous waste and determined that HR Construction Services, LLC has submitted the lowest and best proposal, which proposal is in the total amount of Nineteen Thousand Eight Hundred Sixty One Dollars and Zero Cents (\$19,861.00) for the construction of a street sweeping pad. Services are to be billed based on actual work performed.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Maple Heights, County of Cuyahoga, State of Ohio, that:

<u>Section 1</u>. The Mayor is authorized to enter into a contract with HR Construction Services, LLC to provide a street sweeping pad for the containment of street sweepings and miscellaneous waste, as more fully described in the price proposal on file in the Office of the Clerk of Council. The total cost for the street sweeping pad shall not exceed Nineteen Thousand Eight Hundred Sixty One Dollars and Zero Cents (\$19,861.00).

Request for Proposal (RFP) Results and Contract Award Recommendation

Dear Council,

Nine (9) Price Proposals were sought and two (2) Price Proposals were received for the Street Sweeping Pad work before the established 4:00 pm Monday March 25, 2019 deadline. The Price Proposals received for the project ranged from a high price proposal of \$23,174.72 to a low price proposal of \$19,861.00.

The City of Maple Heights is currently operating under the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency MS4 (Municipal Separate Storm Water System) permit which requires the City of Maple Heights to provide effective storm water management. Minimum Control Measure (MCM) 6 of the MS4 permit requires that the City of Maple Heights develop an operation and maintenance program that has the ultimate goal of preventing or reducing pollutant runoff from municipal operations. The construction of a street sweeping pad will effectively address the MCM 6 permit requirements.

The City of Maple Heights agreement with the Northeast Ohio Regional Sewer District (NEORSD) calls for the cost of miscellaneous stormwater pollution prevention activities, including the containment of street sweepings and miscellaneous material, to be reimbursed through the Community Cost Share Program up to a total of \$135,000.00. The cost of this project is 100% reimbursable by the NEORSD.

Copies of the proposals are attached for your use. In the case of HR Construction Services, LLC and Resitech Construction, the proposals were submitted with the substantial completion date not correlating with the proposed start date and number of days to complete. This discrepancy is inconsequential to the proposals and total completion date of June 28, 2019. The lowest and best price proposal was submitted by HR Construction Services, LLC, MBE, CSB, FBE, LPE certified with a proposal amount of \$19,861.00. I recommend that Council authorize the Mayor to enter into a contract with HR Construction Services, LLC for the Street Sweeping Pad work per the submitted proposal.

The earliest start date for the project was given as April 15, 2019 and the number of days to complete is 12 days. I will be attending the Wednesday April 3, 2019 Council Caucus meeting to discuss the project in greater detail. 
