A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT TO PROVIDE FOR THE NORTHEAST QUADRANT SEWER REPAIRS PHASE 3 PROJECT IN THE CITY OF MAPLE HEIGHTS AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, on October 7, 2015, by Resolution 2015-63, Council authorized and directed the City Engineer to begin the preparation of plans and specifications and to provide advertising for bids for the storm and sanitary sewer improvement project on various city streets including Hansen, Watson, Raymond, Franklin, Hillgrove, Clare and Gardenview in the City of Maple Heights; and

WHEREAS, the Ohio Public Works Commission contributed Three Hundred Forty-Nine Thousand Nine Hundred Fifty Dollars and Zero Cents (\$349,950.00), for Phase 1 and Phase 2 of the repair of storm and sanitary sewers on various city streets including Hansen, Watson, Raymond, Franklin, Hillgrove, Clare and Gardenview; and

WHEREAS, on November 7, 2018, by Resolution 2018-96, Council authorized and directed the Mayor to enter into a 2019 Member Community Infrastructure Program with the Northeast Ohio Regional Sewer District (NEORSD) for the Manhole Sewer Separation Project in the City of Maple Heights which included the repair of storm and sanitary sewers on various city streets including Hansen, Watson, Raymond, Franklin, Hillgrove, Clare and Gardenview; and

WHEREAS, the City of Maple Heights was awarded Five Hundred Ninety-Nine Thousand Nine Hundred Fifty Dollars and Zero Cents \$599,950.00 by the Northeast Ohio Regional Sewer District (NEORSD) for Phase 1 and Phase 2 of the repair of storm and sanitary sewers on various city streets including Hansen, Watson, Raymond, Franklin, Hillgrove, Clare and Gardenview; and

WHEREAS, the City of Maple Heights has entered into an agreement with the Cuyahoga County Department of Public Works to maintain and operate the entire City of Maple Heights-owned storm and sanitary sewer systems, also designated as County Sewer District No.9; and

WHEREAS, the Cuyahoga County Department of Public Works has established a schedule of just and equitable rates to be collected from the owners of all parcels within the City that have accessibility to storm and sanitary sewers; and

WHEREAS, upon collection by the County Treasurer, such storm and sanitary sewer system monies have been placed in a distinct fund to the credit of Sewer District No. 9; and

- WHEREAS, the Cuyahoga County Department of Public Works has committed to provide Sewer District No. 9 funds in the amount of up to Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars and Zero Cents (\$250,000.00) as the required local funding match for storm and sanitary sewer improvement projects on various city streets including Hansen, Watson, Raymond, Franklin, Hillgrove, Clare and Gardenview; and
- WHEREAS, on September 4, 2019, by Resolution 2019-75, the City of Maple Heights entered into a contract with Fabrizi Trucking and Paving Co., Inc., for the Northeast Quadrant Sewer Repairs Phase 1 Project, which was completed in Spring 2020, and
- **WHEREAS**, on September 16, 2020, by **Resolution 2020-82**, the City of Maple Heights entered into a contract with United Survey, Inc., for the Northeast Quadrant Sewer Repairs Phase 2 Project, which was completed in Summer 2021, and
- WHEREAS, on February 23, 2021, by Resolution 2021-17, Council authorized the Mayor to enter into a 2021 Member Community Infrastructure Program with the Northeast Ohio Regional Sewer District for the Manhole Sewer Separation Project in the City of Maple Heights which included additional repair of storm and sanitary sewers on various city streets including Hansen, Watson, Raymond, Franklin, Hillgrove, Clare and Gardenview; and
- **WHEREAS**, the City of Maple Heights had been awarded One Million Twenty-One Thousand Eight Hundred Eighty-Seven Dollars and Zero Cents (\$1,021,887.00) by the Northeast Ohio Regional Sewer District (NEORSD) for the repair of storm and sanitary sewers on various city streets including Hansen, Watson, Raymond, Franklin, Hillgrove, Clare and Gardenview; and
- WHEREAS, the Ohio Public Works Commission is contributing up to Fifty-Three Percent (53%) of the cost, up to a maximum of One Million Four Hundred Thirty-Three Thousand One Hundred Thirteen Dollars and Zero Cents (\$1,433,113.00), for additional work to repair storm and sanitary sewers and resurface various city streets including Hansen, Watson, Raymond, Franklin, Hillgrove, Clare and Gardenview; and
- **WHEREAS**, on November 11, 2021, the bids for the Northeast Quadrant Sewer Repairs Phase 3 Project, which includes the repair of storm and sanitary sewers on Hansen, Raymond, Franklin, and Gardenview, were opened and inspected by the City Engineer to determine the lowest and best bid.

The Council of the City of Maple Heights hereby authorizes the Mayor to enter into a contract with Fabrizi Trucking and Paving Co., Inc., for the Northeast Quadrant Sewer Repairs Phase 3 Project, for a cost not to exceed Two Hundred Thirty-One Thousand Six Hundred Thirty-Two Dollars and Zero Cents (\$231,632.00) as more fully described in the bid record on file in the Office of the Finance Director in the City of Maple Heights.

WHEREAS, the Maple Heights Land Reutilization Program fosters the return of non-productive land to tax revenue generating status or the dedication thereof to public use; and

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AND RESTATING THE AUTHORIZED PAY SCHEDULE FOR NON-BARGAINING UNIT CITY EMPLOYEES FOR 2022 AND 2023, AND PROVIDING A HIGH DEDUCTIBLE HEALTH INSURANCE PLAN WITH A HEALTHCARE SAVINGS ACCOUNT (HSA) AND ESTABLISHING CONTRIBUTION AMOUNTS TO THE HSA ACCOUNTS FOR NON-BARGAINING UNIT CITY EMPLOYEES BEGINNING 2022, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Article IV of the City Charter and Cod. Ord. Sec. 260.29, Council desires to authorize the Pay Schedule for all full-time and part-time non-bargaining unit employees for 2022 and 2023; and

WHEREAS, bargaining unit employees will receive a 2% pay raise effective January 1, 2022, and an additional 2% pay raise effective January 1, 2023, and the Administration recommends that non-bargaining unit employees receive the same pay raises; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and the Finance Director have recommended that the positions of Director Human Resources, Engineer, Assistant Engineer, Evidence Custodian, and Administrative Interns be added to the Authorized Pay Schedule for non-bargaining unit employees; and

WHEREAS, the City provides all bargaining unit employees with a high deductible health insurance plan, eligible for a Healthcare Savings Account (HSA), which beginning January 1, 2022, bargaining unit employees will be making monthly deductible contributions of \$150 for single plan coverage (\$1,800 per year) and \$300 for family plan coverage (\$3,600 per year) into their HSA account, with the City contributing into the employee's HSA account the remaining monthly amount necessary to fully fund the annual deductible for each employee's HSA plan, and the Administration recommends that the same health insurance plan be provided with the same deductible contributions for all non-bargaining unit employees;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Maple Heights, County of Cuyahoga, State of Ohio, that:

Section 1. The City shall provide all non-bargaining unit employees with a high deductible health insurance plan, eligible for a Healthcare Savings Account (HSA), which beginning January 1, 2022, non-bargaining unit employees will be making monthly deductible contributions of \$150 for single plan coverage (\$1,800 per year) and \$300 for family plan coverage (\$3,600 per year) into their HSA account, with the City contributing into the non-bargaining unit employee's HSA account the remaining monthly amount necessary to fully fund the annual deductible for each employee's HSA plan. Half of the non-bargaining unit employee's monthly contribution toward the deductible will be deducted in each of the first two pays each month. The City shall advance funds into a non-bargaining unit employee's HSA account to be used towards satisfying the employee's annual HSA deductible should the employee be faced with a healthcare crisis which requires the employee to pay more than the amount currently available in the employee's HSA account to meet the required annual deductible. The City shall not advance more than the respective annual deductible amounts for single and family HSA plans. However, if an employee shall leave employment before using the advanced funds then the employee shall refund the unused, advanced funds to the City. Non-bargaining unit employees shall be permitted to opt out of, and waive the coverage provided by, the City's medical, dental and vision insurance. Employees must opt out of all insurance plans. For example, employees cannot elect to opt out of the medical insurance and continue to participate in the dental and vision insurance. Employees who opt out and waive coverage shall receive Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) a month for each month that coverage is waived by the employee. Employees wishing to opt out and waive coverage must notify the Finance Director of their intent, in writing, by the 10th day of the month for which waiver of coverage is sought. Once the employee opts out the employee is not eligible to be covered by the City provided medical, dental and vision insurance plan until the annual renewal period is open or the employee becomes eligible due to a qualifying event whereby the employee loses their other medical insurance.
