WHEREAS, pursuant to Chapter 680 of the City's Codified Ordinances, "Nuisance" means an unreasonable interference with a right common to the general public, including conduct that significantly interferes with public health, safety, peace, comfort, or convenience; conduct that is contrary to a statute, ordinance, or regulation; or conduct that is of a continuing nature or has produced a permanent or long-lasting effect, and has a significant effect upon the public right, of which the actor is aware or should be aware; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor, the Housing Manager and the Building Department have found and reported their findings to Council that the residential property located at 5504 Grasmere Avenue, Maple Heights has been determined to be structurally unsound and not abated despite written notices from the Building Department to the property owner to abate by demolishing and razing the property and disposing of all debris; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor, the Housing Manager and the Building Department have recommended that based on the reported findings, and pursuant to Section 680.06(c) of the City's Codified Ordinances, Council declare the property located at 5504 Grasmere Avenue to be a Nuisance because of the deterioration of the structure such that it is a is a hazard to the health, safety or welfare of its occupants and to the public and that, if not abated, will become a blighting or deteriorating factor in the neighborhood that impairs or adversely affects the value of neighboring property.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Maple Heights, County of Cuyahoga, State of Ohio that:

- Section 1. Council, pursuant to Section 680.06(c) of the City's Codified Ordinances, hereby declares the residential property located at 5504 Grasmere Avenue to be a Nuisance because of the deterioration of the structure such that it is a is a hazard to the health, safety or welfare of its occupants and to the public and that, if not abated, will become a blighting or deteriorating factor in the neighborhood that impairs or adversely affects the value of neighboring property.
- Section 2. The Mayor, Housing Manager, Building Department, Service Director and Law Director are authorized and directed to cause the Nuisance to be abated in accordance with Chapter 680 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Maple Heights, in any manner determined by them to be appropriate and necessary, including demolishing and razing the structure and/or revoking the Certificate of Occupancy.

WHEREAS, the Department of Development carries out various housing and community development activities with Community Development Block Grant ("CDBG") funds including funding eligible activities carried out by other units of local government through the County's Municipal Grant Program, which eligible activities include: a) community master plans; b) housing and commercial demolition; c) infrastructure; d) public safety; e) streetscapes; f) parks and playgrounds; or g) community and senior centers; and

WHEREAS, the City Of Maple Heights is a local government eligible to receive CDBG funding for an eligible activity through the Municipal Grant Program; and

WHEREAS, The Mayor, Director of Economic Development and Engineer have advised Council that CDBG funds may be available through the 2021 Community Development Block Grant program through the Cuyahoga County Department of Development in an amount not exceeding One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars and No Cents (\$150,000.00), to fund improvements at Stafford Park, including improving the Park's trail network to make it accessible to persons with disabilities pursuant to the Americans With Disabilities Act (ADA) (Stafford Park Restoration Project, Phase 1).

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 714.02 of the Cuyahoga County Code, there is created the Cuyahoga County Community Supplemental Block Grant program (CDSG) to be administered in conjunction with and using the same grant process as the County Community Development Block Grant Program; and

WHEREAS, the Cuyahoga County Community Development Supplemental Grant (CDSG) program shall be administered by the Cuyahoga County Executive through the Cuyahoga County Department of Development; and

WHEREAS, the CDSG program shall be funded through the County Casino Revenue Fund established in Chapter 709 of the County Code. Fifteen percent (15%) of the funds transferred into the Casino Revenue Fund annually shall be used to fund projects approved through the Cuyahoga County Community Development Supplemental Grant program (CDSG); and

WHEREAS, CDSG funds are available to eligible municipal corporations to fund projects meeting a community development need related to the health or welfare of the community, which projects include: a) community master plans; b) housing and commercial demolition; c) infrastructure; d) public safety; e) streetscapes; f) parks and playgrounds; or g) community and senior centers; and

WHEREAS, the City Of Maple Heights is a municipal corporation eligible to receive CDSG funding for an eligible activity through the Municipal Grant Program; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor, Director of Economic Development and Housing Manager have advised Council that CDSG funds may be available through the 2022 Cuyahoga County Community Development Supplemental Grant (CDSG) program through the Cuyahoga County Department of Development in an amount not to exceed Fifty Thousand Dollars and Zero Cents (\$50,000.00), to fund an exterior maintenance grant program and maintain the City's housing stock. (Maple Heights Exterior Maintenance Grant Program).

AN ORDINANCE WAIVING FOR THE TIME PERIOD JANUARY 1, 2022 THROUGH DECEMBER 31, 2022 THE ONE HUNDRED PERCENT (100%) ESCROW REQUIREMENT TO CORRECT VIOLATIONS RESULTING FROM POINT OF SALE INSPECTIONS PER CHAPTER 1494 OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF MAPLE HEIGHTS TO OFFER AN INCENTIVE TO INDIVIDUALS WHO PURCHASE RESIDENTIAL PROPERTIES AND OCCUPY SUCH RESIDENTIAL PROPERTIES, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the City of Maple Heights desires to continue an Owner Occupied Homeowner Incentive Program for the period January 1, 2022 through December 31, 2022, which was initially established pursuant to **Ordinance No. 2017-08**, to promote and encourage individuals to purchase and renovate residential properties by waiving 100% of the escrow requirement to correct violations resulting from the point of sale inspection per Chapter 1494, so long as the purchaser actually occupies such residential property.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of the City of Maple Heights, County of Cuyahoga, State of Ohio that:

For the time period January 1, 2022 through December 31, 2022 the Mayor is hereby authorized to waive the 100% escrow requirement to correct violations resulting from point of sale inspections per Chapter 1494 of the Codified Ordinances for individuals who purchase and renovate residential properties, so long as the purchaser actually occupies such residential property.
- Section 2. Participants in this Program will be required to sign an affidavit attesting to the fact that the Purchaser will reside in the property as their primary residence for two (2) years commencing upon the issuance of an Occupancy Permit by the Chief Building Official.
