WHEREAS, Gergely Fazakas ("the Developer") has advised the Mayor and Planning and Development Director that he desires to purchase the one (1) vacant condominium unit owned by the City located at 16235 EDGEWOOD CT (PPN 786-02-831(C)) (referred to as the "Property"), for rehabilitation; and

WHEREAS, the Property is owned by the City through its Land Reutilization Program and the Mayor desires to sell the Property to the Developer, with the Developer required to rehabilitate the existing condominium and keep it as a condominium unit as originally designed; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to R.C. 5722.07, the fair market value of the Property, as determined by the Cuyahoga County Fiscal Officer, and after taking into account the required minimum improvements, is Ten Thousand Dollars and Zero Cents (\$10,000.00).

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Maple Heights, County of Cuyahoga, State of Ohio that:

- <u>Section 1.</u> The Mayor is hereby authorized to enter into an Agreement with Gergely Fazakas ("the Developer") to sell the one (1) vacant condominium unit owned by the City located at **16235 EDGEWOOD CT (PPN 786-02-831(C))** (referred to as the "Property") at a sales price of \$10,000.00 with the Developer required to rehabilitate the existing living unit in compliance with all State of Ohio Building Code Standards.

WHEREAS, the Cuyahoga County Council, per Resolution No. R2022-0272, awarded funding from the District 8 ARPA Community Grant Fund in the amount of \$140,000.00 to the City of Maple Heights for the Maple Heights Senior Center Emergency Generator Project; and

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO EXECUTE EASEMENT DOCUMENTS FOR PUBLIC SIDEWALK FACILITIES OVER PRIVATE PROPERTIES ON DUNHAM ROAD, AND DECLARING AND EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, on April 7, 2021 Council passed **Ordinance No. 2021-27** which authorized an agreement of cooperation with the County of Cuyahoga, Ohio, to improve a portion of public highway described as Dunham Road between Turney Road and Libby Road; and

WHEREAS, through the agreement of cooperation with the County of Cuyahoga, the City of Maple Heights will be responsible for 40%, and the County of Cuyahoga will be responsible for 60%, of the cost of the preparation of construction plans and specifications, including necessary engineering reports, for the improvement of Dunham Road between Turney Road and Libby Road; and

WHEREAS, through the agreement of cooperation with the County of Cuyahoga, the County of Cuyahoga will arrange for the supervision and administration of the construction project; and

WHEREAS, on October 6, 2021 Council passed Ordinance No. 2021-117 which authorized the City Engineer to begin the preparation of plans and specifications for the improvement of Dunham Road between Turney Road and Libby Road in City of Maple Heights and coordinate directly with the County of Cuyahoga to arrange for the supervision and administration of the construction project as required; and

WHEREAS, The City Engineer has advised the Mayor that he will require the acquisition of various temporary work easements and permanent sidewalk easements along Dunham Road for the installation of public sidewalk facilities over private property; and

WHEREAS, the owners of certain properties located on Dunham Road within the City of Maple Heights have been offered appropriate consideration to grant certain easements upon their properties on Dunham Road to the City for the installation of public sidewalk facilities; and

WHEREAS, this Council desires to authorize and to accept these easements.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Maple Heights, County of Cuyahoga, State of Ohio that:

<u>Section 1</u>. The Mayor be, and is hereby, authorized to negotiate, execute and accept grants of easement from the owners of **Dunham Road Permanent Parcel Nos. 785-15-013 and 785-15-014**, for public sidewalk facilities in a form as generally set forth in Exhibit A attached hereto and incorporated herein.

WHEREAS, the City of Maple Heights, upon application of the City Engineer, was awarded a grant in the amount of Seven Hundred Fifty-Four Thousand Nine Hundred Fifty-Three Dollars and Zero Cents (\$754,953.00) for the Rowena Avenue Watermain Replacement Project from the Cleveland Water Department through the Suburban Water Main Renewal (SWMR) program; and

WHEREAS, the City of Maple Heights, upon application of the City Engineer, was awarded a grant in the amount of Six Hundred Seventy Thousand Five Hundred Ninety-Seven Dollars and Zero Cents (\$670,597.00) for the Rowena Avenue and Mendota Avenue Watermain Replacement Projects by the Ohio Public Works Commission (OPWC) which will provide funding for up to Twenty Eight Percent (28%) of the Rowena Avenue Watermain Replacement Project cost; and

WHEREAS, on September 16, 2020, by Resolution No. 2020-80, Council authorized and directed the City Engineer to begin the preparation of plans and specifications and to provide advertising for bids for the Rowena Avenue Watermain Replacement Project in the City of Maple Heights: and

WHEREAS, on October 15, 2021, the bids for the Rowena Avenue Watermain Replacement Project were opened and inspected by the City Engineer to determine the lowest and best bid; and

WHEREAS, on October 20, 2021, by Resolution No. 2021-128, the Council of the City of Maple Heights hereby authorized the Mayor, to enter into a contract with Terrace Construction Company, Inc. for the Rowena Avenue Watermain Replacement Project, for a cost not to exceed One Million One Hundred Fifty-Five Thousand Seven Hundred Ninety-Nine Dollars and Sixty-Nine Cents (\$1,155,799.69), as more fully described in the bid record on file in the Office of the Finance Director in the City of Maple Heights; and

WHEREAS, the City Engineer has recommended that additional work be performed to repair severely deteriorated concrete pavement base and curbs as discovered during the installation of the water main on Rowena Avenue between Dunham Road and Lee Road; and

WHEREAS, the City Engineer has determined that the cost of the additional pavement and curb replacement work, when combined with quantity adjustments to contract line items for actual work performed,

will increase the contract for the Rowena Avenue Watermain Replacement Project in the amount of Thirty-Seven Thousand One Hundred Thirty-Seven Dollars and Sixty-Seven Cents (\$37,137.67); and

WHEREAS, the City Engineer has confirmed that the additional work can be paid for with county funds that are currently available to supplement existing grant, county and local funding.

WHEREAS, the Service Director had informed the Mayor and the Engineer that the pavement conditions on various streets located within the City of Maple Heights makes it necessary to perform repairs, reconstruction and preventative maintenance on various streets within the City; and

WHEREAS, the Engineer had previously prepared a street inventory which rated pavement conditions for streets located within the City of Maple Heights for use in the development of a potential citywide pavement maintenance program; and

WHEREAS, Council deemed it necessary and in the best interests of the health, safety and welfare of all of the City residents to perform routine repairs and preventative maintenance on various streets within the City of Maple Heights; and

WHEREAS, on August 4, 2021, by Resolution No. 2021-85, Council authorized and directed the City Engineer to begin the preparation of plans and specifications and to provide advertising for bids for the 2021 Roadway Repair Program in the City of Maple Heights: and

WHEREAS, on August 26, 2021, the bids for the 2021 Roadway Repair Program were opened and inspected by the City Engineer to determine the lowest and best bid; and

WHEREAS, on September 1, 2021, by Resolution No. 2021-94, Council authorized the Mayor, to enter into a contract with Specialized Construction, Inc., for the 2021 Roadway Repair Program, for a cost not to exceed Four Hundred Seventy-One Thousand Four Hundred Dollars and Zero Cents (\$471,400.00), as more fully described in the bid record on file in the Office of the Finance Director in the City of Maple Heights; and

WHEREAS, the City Engineer has determined that the quantity adjustments to contract line items for actual work performed, when combined with the cost of work items not included within the original contract documents, will decrease the contract for the 2021 Roadway Repair Program in the amount of Twenty-Seven Thousand Five Hundred Eighty-Five Dollars and Eighty-Five Cents (\$27,585.85).

AN ORDINANCE REPEALING SECTION 260.23 OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF MAPLE HEIGHTS CONCERNING COMPENSATION, FRINGE BENEFITS, AND PENSION PICK-UP FOR SAFETY PERSONNEL EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1, 2023, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the Law Director has recommended that Section 260.23 of the City's Codified Ordinances concerning compensation, fringe benefits, and pension pick-up for safety personnel be repealed effective January 1, 2023 because the terms of such compensation, fringe benefits and pension are determined exclusively through collective bargaining with the labor organizations representing the City's Police and Fire Departments pursuant to Ohio's Collective Bargaining Act, R.C. Chapter 4117 et seq. In addition, the Council retains the authority, without regard to Section 260.23, to determine the terms of the compensation, fringe benefits and pension for the Police and Fire Chiefs and other non-bargaining unit safety personnel.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Maple Heights, County of Cuyahoga, State of Ohio, that:

<u>Section 1.</u> Section 260.23 of the City's Codified Ordinances, set forth below with its provisions struck through, is hereby repealed, in its entirety:

260.23 COMPENSATION AND FRINGE BENEFITS FOR SAFETY PERSONNEL; PENSION PICK-UP.

- (a) The pay rate for the position of Police Captain shall be six and one half percent greater than the pay rate for the position of Police Lieutenant-OIC Detective Bureau.
- (b) The pay rate for the position of Police Chief shall be ten percent greater than the pay rate for the position of Police Captain.

(Ord. 1997-63. Passed 6-18-97.)

- (c) The annual pay rate for the Fire Chief shall be equal to the annual pay rate of the Police Chief.
- (d) The annual pay rate for the Fire Captain/Assistant to the Chief shall be equal to the annual pay rate of the Police Lieutenant-O.I.C.
- (e) All fringe benefits received by bargaining unit personnel in the Police and Fire Divisions, respectively, shall apply to non-bargaining unit sworn personnel in those Divisions (Chiefs, Captains) unless otherwise specifically modified by this chapter.
 (Ord. 1992-10. Passed 1-23-92.)
- (f) Effective January 1, 1992, the City shall institute a pension pickup plan for all full-time positions except those covered by collective bargaining agreements, as provided in Section 260.24.

(g) Effective January 1, 1992, the City shall institute a pension pickup by reduction for all full-time positions as provided in Section 260.24.

Section 2. The Clerk of Council is authorized to forward a certified copy of this Ordinance to the publisher of the Codified Ordinances of the City for removal of Section 260.23, as repealed, in the current print and electronic editions of the City's Codified Ordinances.

<u>Section 3.</u> It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting on the date indicated below, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its Committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 4. This Ordinance constitutes an emergency measure necessary for the public peace, safety and general welfare of the City and for the further reason that it is necessary to immediately remove repealed sections of the Code, and provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds (2/3) of the members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor, otherwise it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
