WHEREAS, the City of Maple Heights, Ohio (hereinafter referred to as "the City") is a municipal entity formed and organized pursuant to the Constitution and laws of the State of Ohio; and

WHEREAS, the people of the State of Ohio and its communities have been harmed by misfeasance, nonfeasance and malfeasance committed by certain entities within the Opioid Pharmaceutical Supply Chain; and

WHEREAS, the State of Ohio, through its Attorney General, and certain Local Governments, through their elected representatives and counsel, are separately engaged in litigation seeking to hold Opioid Pharmaceutical Supply Chain Participants accountable for the damage caused by their misfeasance, nonfeasance and malfeasance; and

WHEREAS, the State of Ohio, through its Governor and Attorney General, and its Local Governments share a common desire to abate and alleviate the impacts of that misfeasance, nonfeasance and malfeasance throughout the State of Ohio; and

WHEREAS, the State and its Local Governments, subject to completing formal documents effectuating the Parties Agreements, have drafted and the City has adopted, and hereby reaffirms its adoption of, a OneOhio Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU") relating to the allocation and the use of the proceeds of any potential settlements described; and

WHEREAS, the MOU has been collaboratively drafted to maintain all individual claims while allowing the State and Local Governments to cooperate in exploring all possible means of resolution; and

WHEREAS, the Council understands that an additional purpose of the MOU is to create an effective means of distributing any potential settlement funds obtained under the MOU between the State of Ohio and Local Governments in a manner and means that would promote an effective and meaningful use of the funds in abating the opioid epidemic throughout Ohio, as well as to permit collaboration and explore potentially effectuation earlier resolution of the Opioid Litigation against Opioid Pharmaceutical Companies; and

WHEREAS, nothing in the MOU binds any party to a specific outcome, but rather, any resolution under the MOU requires acceptance by the State of Ohio and the Local Governments; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Ordinance No. 2021-152, Council approved the City's participation in nationwide settlements reached in 2021 to resolve all opioids litigation brought by states and local political subdivisions against the three largest pharmaceutical distributors—McKesson, Cardinal Health, and AmerisourceBergen ("Distributors")—and against manufacturer Janssen Pharmaceuticals, Inc. and its parent company Johnson & Johnson (collectively, "J&J"). These "2021 National Opioid Settlements" have been finalized, and payments have already begun. In all, the Distributors will pay up to \$21 billion over 18 years, and J&J will pay up to an additional \$5 billion over no more than nine years; and

WHEREAS, an additional national opioid settlement agreement dated November 22, 2022 was reached with TEVA, ALLERGAN, CVS, WALGREENS and WALMART ("2022 National Opioid Settlements") to resolve governmental entity claims in the State of Ohio using the structure of the MOU; and

WHEREAS, assuming maximum participation nationwide, the 2022 National Opioid Settlements require:

TEVA to pay up to \$3.34 billion over 13 years and to provide either \$1.2 billion of its generic version of the drug Narcan over 10 years or \$240 million of cash in lieu of product, as each state may elect; ALLERGAN to pay up to \$2.02 billion over 7 years; CVS to pay up to \$4.90 billion over 10 years; WALGREENS to pay up to \$5.52 billion over 15 years; and WALMART to pay up to \$2.74 billion in 2023, and all payments to be made within 6 years.

WHEREAS, Council desires to accept and agree to the material terms of the proposed 2022 National Opioid Settlements and participate therein;

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO ENTER INTO A PURCHASE AGREEMENT WITH BUS SERVICE INCORPORATED FOR A 2022 STARLITE TRANSIT 350 HD BUS IN THE AMOUNT OF ONE HUNDRED TWELVE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED SIXTEEN DOLLARS AND ZERO CENTS (\$112,916.00) THROUGH THE OHIO DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION COOPERATIVE PURCHASING PROGRAM, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Cod. Ord. Sec. 210.05, the City is authorized to engage in cooperative purchasing through the competitive bids obtained by the State of Ohio Department of Transportation Cooperative Purchasing Program; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Human Services Director have advised Council that the City is in need of a new vehicle to provide transportation services for the City's Human Services Transportation Program, and the purchase of the vehicle can be made through the Ohio Department of Transportation's Cooperative Purchasing Program; and

WHEREAS, the City has received funding from NOACA through the Enhanced Mobility For Seniors And Individuals With Disabilities Program to be used towards the cost to purchase a new vehicle to provide transportation services for the City's Human Services Transportation Program; and;

WHEREAS, Council desires to authorize the purchase of a new vehicle with the specifications recommended by the Human Services Director through Bus Service Incorporated, an approved contractor in the Ohio Department of Transportation's Cooperative Purchasing Program, through Contract No. 248-22.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Maple Heights, County of Cuyahoga, State of Ohio, that:

Section 1. The Mayor is hereby authorized to enter into a purchase agreement with Bus Services Incorporated, a copy of which is on file in the Finance Department, for the purchase of a 2022 Starlite Transit 350 HD Bus, VIN No. NKA31332, in the amount of One Hundred Twelve Thousand Nine Hundred Sixteen Dollars and Zero Cents (\$112,916.00), through the Ohio Department of Transportation Cooperative Purchasing Program, Contract No. 248-22.

Section 2: The Finance Director is hereby, authorized to appropriate to a proper account a sum sufficient to cover the cost of said purchase agreement referred to in Section 1 above, or secure appropriate financing options subject to the City's Fiscal Policies adopted and approved by Council.

<u>Section 3.</u> It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting on the date indicated below, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its Committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 4. This Resolution constitutes an emergency measure necessary for the public safety, health and welfare and for the further reason that the vehicle is on special hold with Bus Service Incorporated and if not purchased immediately the hold will be released, and provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds (2/3) of the members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor, otherwise it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
