AN ORDINANCE WAIVING FOR THE TIME PERIOD JANUARY 1, 2024 THROUGH DECEMBER 31, 2024 THE ONE HUNDRED PERCENT (100%) ESCROW REQUIREMENT TO CORRECT VIOLATIONS RESULTING FROM POINT OF SALE INSPECTIONS PER CHAPTER 1494 OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF MAPLE HEIGHTS TO OFFER AN INCENTIVE TO INDIVIDUALS WHO PURCHASE RESIDENTIAL PROPERTIES AND OCCUPY SUCH RESIDENTIAL PROPERTIES, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the City of Maple Heights desires to continue an Owner Occupied Homeowner Incentive Program for the period January 1, 2024 through December 31, 2024, which was initially established pursuant to **Ordinance No. 2017-08**, to promote and encourage individuals to purchase and renovate residential properties by waiving 100% of the escrow requirement to correct violations resulting from the point of sale inspection per Chapter 1494, so long as the purchaser actually occupies such residential property.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of the City of Maple Heights, County of Cuyahoga, State of Ohio that:

Section 1. For the time period January 1, 2024 through December 31, 2024 the Mayor is hereby authorized to waive the 100% escrow requirement to correct violations resulting from point of sale inspections per Chapter 1494 of the Codified Ordinances for individuals who purchase and renovate residential properties, so long as the purchaser actually occupies such residential property.

Section 2. Participants in this Program will be required to sign an affidavit attesting to the fact that the Purchaser will reside in the property as their primary residence for two (2) years commencing upon the issuance of an Occupancy Permit by the Chief Building Official.

Section 3. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting, on the date indicated below, and that all deliberations of Council and of any of its Committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 4. This Ordinance constitutes an emergency measure necessary for the general welfare of the residents, and to encourage owner occupied home ownership in the City and provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds (2/3) of the members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor, otherwise it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 1486.02 OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF MAPLE HEIGHTS CONCERNING RENEWAL OF RENTAL REGISTRATIONS AND ESTABLISHING FEES, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the Building and Housing Department have recommended to Council that Section 1486.02 of the City's Codified Ordinances concerning rental registrations be amended to provide that owners of rental property register all of their properties on an annual basis based upon the type of property (residential rental properties or commercial rental properties) under a scaled approach based upon the number of units a given landlord entity, such as an LLC, owns and manages in the City and establishing the fees for this revised rental registration program.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Maple Heights, County of Cuyahoga, State of Ohio that:

- **Section 1.** Section 1486.02 of the City's Codified Ordinances is hereby amended to read as follows with deletions struck through and additions underlined:
- (a)(1) Effective January 1, 2024, each owner of a residential property both residential and eommercial, as defined in Section 1486.01(f), or the agent in charge as defined in Section 1486.01(a), of a rental unit within the City shall register all such rental units on a rental registration form, per owner or agent in charge, with the Building Department on an annual basis, no later than March 31 of each calendar year according to the following fee schedule based upon the number of living units: 1-10 living units a non-refundable rental registration fee of \$75 per owner or agent in charge. Over 10 living units a non-refundable rental registration fee of \$175.00 per owner or agent in charge. If the owner or agent in charge acquires additional rental units during the calendar year then, within thirty days after the date of acquiring ownership or transfer of the title, and while the unit is still vacant, the owner or agent in charge shall file an updated rental registration with the Building Department for a non-refundable fee of \$35. The form to be used by the owner or agent in charge to register all their rental units shall be contained in a "rental registration packet" available from the Maple Heights Building Department. A separate rental registration packet shall be required for each owner or agent in charge.
- (a)(2) Effective January 1, 2024, each owner of a commercial property, as defined in Section 1486.01(f), or the agent in charge as defined in Section 1486.01(a), of a rental unit within the City shall register all such rental units on a rental registration form, per owner or agent in charge, with the Building Department on an annual basis, no later than March 31 of each calendar year for a flat rate fee of \$175.00 per building.

Section 2. The Clerk of Council is authorized to forward a certified copy of this Ordinance to the publisher of the Codified Ordinances of the City for immediate inclusion of amended Sections 1486.02 in the current print and electronic editions of the City's Codified Ordinances.

<u>Section 3.</u> It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting on the date indicated below, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its Committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 4. This Ordinance constitutes an emergency measure necessary for the public peace, safety and general welfare of the City and for the further reason that notice of this change must be provided to landlords prior to the March 31 rental registration deadline, and provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds (2/3) of the members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor, otherwise it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
