WHEREAS, after leaving employment with the City in September 2021, Ciresi was reemployed by the City in August 2022, and re-appointed Service Director in November 2022; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the vacation schedule set forth in Cod. Ord. Sect. 260.05, since Ciresi's re-employment period is currently only one (1) year, he is only entitled to two (2) weeks of vacation; and

WHEREAS, in recognition of Ciresi's prior 27 years of service with the City, and the fact that, as Service Director he is a Department Head, the Mayor desires to increase his available vacation time to four (4) weeks, effective January 1, 2024; and

WHEREAS, Council desires to permit an exception to the employee vacation schedule set forth in Cod. Ord. Sect. 260.05 and authorize the Mayor to increase the vacation time for Service Director Ciresi from two (2) weeks to four (4) weeks, effective January 1, 2024, with future increases in Ciresi's weeks of vacation time that are not covered by the schedule set forth in Cod. Ord. Sect. 260.05, being subject to approval by the Mayor and Council;

WHEREAS, Ohio Revised Code Chapter 3709 requires every municipality in Ohio to provide health services to their residents through either a City Health District or by contract with the County Health District; and

WHEREAS, the Cuyahoga County Board of Health is charging a uniform rate of \$7.25 per capita based on the population of the City of Maple Heights according to the September 2021 Census for calendar year 2024 and a uniform rate of \$8.00 per capita for calendar year 2025.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Maple Heights, County of Cuyahoga, State of Ohio, that:

Section 1. The Mayor is hereby authorized to enter into a contract with the Cuyahoga County Board of Health, a copy of which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference, which will provide health services to Maple Heights residents for the year 2024 at a rate of Seven Dollars and Twenty-Five Cents (\$7.25) per person, with the total cost not to exceed the sum of One Hundred Seventy-One Thousand Eight Hundred Thirty-Two Dollars and No Cents (\$171,832.00) and for the year 2025 at a rate of Eight Dollars and Zero Cents (\$8.00) per person, with the total cost not to exceed the sum of One Hundred Eighty-Nine Thousand Six Hundred Eight Dollars and No Cents (\$189,608.00).

WHEREAS, the Cuyahoga County Board of Health (CCBH) applied for an Urban Tree Canopy Restoration Project grant, in partnership with the City of Maple Heights, from the Ohio Department of Natural Resources (ODNR), Division of Forestry, to expand the tree canopy in Maple Heights by purchasing, planting, and maintaining approximately 50-60 trees in the City during the time period September 2023-September 2025; and

WHEREAS, CCBH was awarded a grant in the amount of \$25,000 by ODNR to partner with Maple Heights in the Urban Tree Canopy Restoration project to expand the tree canopy in Maple Heights; and

WHEREAS, Maple Heights, through a Sub-Recipient Agreement with CCBH agrees to provide services, including the purchase and installation of trees, and CCBH agrees to reimburse Maple Heights for the services provided, up to the amount of the grant, all as is more fully set forth in the Sub-Recipient Agreement, a copy of which is on file in the Office of the City Engineer; and

WHEREAS, Council finds that it is in the best interest of the health, safety and welfare of all of the City residents to partner with CCBH in the Urban Tree Canopy Restoration Project as set forth in the Sub-Recipient Agreement with CCBH and expand the tree canopy in the City.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Maple Heights, County of Cuyahoga, State of Ohio that:

WHEREAS, Sec. 1262.03(F) of the MH Codified Ordinances provides: "Council has the authority to review and overrule any decision of the Planning & Zoning Commission, by ordinance or resolution, passed by two-thirds (2/3) vote of the members elected to Council within forty-five (45) business days of the date of the decision, provided that * * * the applicant notifies the Secretary to the Planning & Zoning Commission and the Chief Building Official of his or her objection in writing within five (5) business days of the date of the decision of the Planning & Zoning Commission. The decision of Council in such matters is final and shall not be subject to appeal except to a court of competent jurisdiction in conformance with state and federal law."; and

WHEREAS, the Applicants timely filed an appeal of the P&Z Decision to Council pursuant to Sec. 1262.03(F) and the Applicants presented their appeal to Council at its August 2, 2023 Council Meeting for review and consideration.
