- <u>Section 2</u>. The Finance Director is authorized to promptly certify a copy of said Alternative Tax Budget Information and transmit the same along with a copy of this Ordinance to the Budget Commission of Cuyahoga County, Ohio.

WHEREAS, GLH LLC ("the Developer") has advised the Mayor and Planning and Development Director that it desires to purchase fifteen (15) vacant lots owned by the City through its Land Reutilization Program and/or Land Bank, which lots are described in Amended Schedule 1 attached hereto and incorporated herein, (each referred to as the "Property", and together as the "Properties") for the construction and sale of a single family, owner-occupied home on each Property; and

WHEREAS, the Properties are owned by the City through its Land Reutilization Program and/or Land Bank and the Mayor desires to enter into a Real Estate Purchase and Development Agreement ("Agreement") with the Developer, a copy of which is on file in the office of the Planning and Development Director, to sell the Properties to the Developer, with the Developer required to build a single family, owner-occupied home on each Property within three (3) years after the effective date of the Agreement ("completion date") and to make the following minimum improvements: 1) the homes must be an owner-occupied single family; and 2) the homes must have at least three (3) bedrooms, two (2) baths, and two (2) off-street parking spaces, one (1) of which must be a totally enclosed attached garage ("the minimum improvements"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to R.C. 5722.07, the fair market value of the fifteen (15) Properties, as determined by the Cuyahoga County Fiscal Officer, and after taking into account the required minimum improvements; the completion date, and the number of Properties purchased at one-time, is a total amount of Thirty-Seven Thousand Five Hundred One Dollars and Zero Cents (\$37,501.00).

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Maple Heights, County of Cuyahoga, State of Ohio that:

Section 1. The Mayor is hereby authorized to enter into the Real Estate Purchase and Development Agreement with the Developer ("Agreement"), a copy of which is on file in the office of the Planning and Development Director, to sell the Properties to the Developer for a total purchase price of Thirty-Seven Thousand Five Hundred One Dollars and Zero Cents (\$37,501.00), with the Developer required to build a single family, owner-occupied home on each Property within three (3) years after the effective date of the Agreement and to make the following minimum improvements: 1) the homes must be an owner-occupied single family; and 2) the homes must have at least three (3) bedrooms, two (2) baths, and two (2) off-street parking spaces, one (1) of which must be a totally enclosed attached garage.

Section 2. Pursuant to R.C. 5722.07, the fair market value of the fifteen (15) Properties, as determined by the Cuyahoga County Fiscal Officer, and after taking into account the required minimum improvements; the completion date, and the number of Properties purchased at one-time, is a total amount of Thirty-Seven Thousand Five Hundred One Dollars and Zero Cents (\$37,501.00). Pursuant to R.C. 5722.08 all of the proceeds from the sale of the Properties shall be used to maintain the remaining parcels of real property held by the City in its Land Reutilization Program.

A RESOLUTION DECLARING THE NECESSITY OF ASSESSING THE EXPENSE OF GARBAGE AND RUBBISH COLLECTION AND DISPOSAL WITHIN THE CITY OF MAPLE HEIGHTS AND CERTIFYING TO THE COUNTY FISCAL OFFICER THE COSTS DUE TO THE CITY OF MAPLE HEIGHTS FOR GARBAGE AND RUBBISH COLLECTIONS, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, Ohio Revised Code Sections 701.05 and 715.43 and Chapter 1060 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Maple Heights permit the assessment for the collection and disposal of garbage and rubbish; and

WHEREAS, Codified Ordinances Section 1060.02(b) provides that the Finance Director establish an estimate of the next year's solid waste collection costs and projected fees for the purpose of establishing the applicable rates for the following year to be charged by the City of Maple Heights for garbage and rubbish collection; and

WHEREAS, the Finance Director has completed this estimate and has determined that the applicable monthly rate for 2025 is \$19.35 per residential unit and \$9.98 for each residential unit for qualified residents with a Homestead exemption as of June 1, 2024 and

WHEREAS, Codified Ordinances Section 1060.02(b)(5) provides that these charges be certified to the County Auditor in time for the charges to be added to the tax duplicate and collected in the next collection year.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Maple Heights, County of Cuyahoga, State of Ohio that:

Section 1. It is the determination of this Council, to proceed with the assessing for the cost and expense of garbage and rubbish disposal within the City in accordance with Ohio Revised Code Sections 701.05 and 715.43 and Chapter 1060 of the Codified Ordinances, upon the lands in the City of Maple Heights on file in the County Fiscal Officer's Office, for the 2024 tax duplicate and collection in the year 2025 at a monthly rate of \$19.35 for each residential unit and \$9.98 for each residential unit for qualified residents with a Homestead exemption as of June 1, 2024.

Section 2: Reimbursement of funds through collection of tax duplicates of said lands as outlined in Section 1 hereof shall be credited to the Solid Waste Collection Fund of the City of Maple Heights.

<u>Section 3.</u> The Finance Director is hereby authorized to send to the Auditor of the County of Cuyahoga certified copies of this Resolution in such numbers as are required.

WHEREAS, the Service Director had informed the Mayor and the Engineer that the pavement conditions on various streets located within the City of Maple Heights makes it necessary to perform repairs, reconstruction and preventative maintenance on various streets within the City; and

WHEREAS, Council deemed it necessary and in the best interests of the health, safety and welfare of all of the City residents to perform routine repairs and preventative maintenance on various streets within the City of Maple Heights; and

WHEREAS, on March 16, 2022, by Resolution No. 2022-26, Council authorized and directed the City Engineer to coordinate with the Service Director to update the street inventory which rates pavement conditions for streets based on ODOT's PCR Manual for the Mayor and Council's use in developing and authorizing a road repair program in the City of Maple Heights; and

WHEREAS, the City Engineer and the Service Director have updated the street inventory which rates pavement conditions, including preliminary estimate of the cost for pavement repairs, and made a recommendation for the streets, which were determined to be in greatest need of repair, for consideration by the Mayor and Council in authorizing a road repair program for the 2024 construction season, such streets being listed in "Exhibit A" attached to this legislation; and

WHEREAS, on January 31, 2024, the Cuyahoga County Executive informed the Mayor that the Cuyahoga County Department of Public Works will reimburse the City for up to \$141,600.00 in material costs expended on County Routes included under a road repair program in the City of Maple Heights; and

WHEREAS, on May 15, 2024, by Resolution No. 2024-45, Council authorized and directed the City Engineer to begin the preparation of plans and specifications and to provide advertising for bids for the 2024 Pavement Repair Program in the City of Maple Heights; and

WHEREAS, on June 27, 2024, the bids for the 2024 Asphalt Roadway Repair Program were opened and inspected by the City Engineer to determine the lowest and best bid.

WHEREAS, Section 240.05 of the City's Codified Ordinances requires that Council must approve all expenditures over Twenty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00), excluding regular employee benefits and expenditures which have not already been authorized by contract or ordinance; and

WHEREAS, the City's general liability insurance is intended to provide coverage only for City authorized events; and

WHEREAS, the decision to use public funds and resources must be memorialized by a duly enacted ordinance or resolution and may have prospective effect only.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Maple Heights, County of Cuyahoga, State of Ohio, that:

Section 1. Council hereby authorizes the use of public funds and resources, including the City's general liability insurance coverage, and the acceptance of private donations, for the
