

RESIDENTIAL PROPERTY TAX ABATEMENT GUIDELINES Department of Economic Development

To encourage property owners in the City of Maple Heights to invest in their properties, City Council passed Ordinance 2020-39 and the State of Ohio approved changes to the City's Property Tax Abatement Program. The Program enables any property owner in the City making qualifying investments in their property to have those investments be tax exempt at a rate and length of time defined below.

New Construction

The construction of new residential structures is eligible to receive a 100% tax abatement for fifteen (15) years for the amount that the assessed value of the property increased. Please note, property owners will still pay property taxes on the assessed value of the land. Only the assessed value associated with the new construction will be abated.

Residential includes single- and two-family homes, condominiums, and multi-family apartment facilities containing twenty-five units or less.

Property owners must apply to the Department of Economic Development within six (6) months of construction completion.

The Tax Abatement Program is administered through the Cuyahoga County Property Appraisal Department and applies to one- and two-family dwelling units. The abatement is for certain new construction and improvement projects that cost at least \$2,500 and cause an increase in the assessed value of the property.

Rehab/Improvement Projects

Eligible rehab/improvement projects are those that increase the taxable value of the home. Normal repairs and maintenance do not increase taxable value of a property. Below are examples of rehab/improvement projects that are eligible and ineligible for property tax abatement. The final determination for a project's value and how much it increases the taxable value of a home is made by the Cuyahoga County Fiscal Office. Conversion from non-residential to residential	New siding or siding repair
Indoor Fireplaces	Tuckpointing, repair, or replacement of masonry
In-ground pools	Scraping and painting home or garage
Install new bathroom	Add or replace gutters or downspouts
Major Rehab Projects	Repair or replace steps, decks, or porches
New Whole House Air Conditioning	Adding or replacing outdoor lighting
New Decks and Porches (Not Replacements)	Adding, repairing, or replacing sidewalks
	New windows or doors

	Kitchen remodel
