



### Dear Neighbor,

April 2, 2019 was the day H.B. 62, Transportation Budget, for the state of Ohio was finally passed. It was signed into law by Gov. Mike DeWine the very next day. However, people are still curious as to what this means for Ohio and what is actually in the Transportation budget.

For starters, the gas tax that was passed will see a 10.7 cents per gallon increase to the state motor fuel tax and a 19 cents-per-gallon increase to the diesel tax. Both will take effect in early July. The money collected from these taxes, around \$865 million each year. This should pay for repairing and constructing Ohio's roads and bridges for the next four to six years. Also \$70 million is being invested into public transit each year. Another main point of this bill is that the front license plate will no longer be required on vehicles. These are some of the bigger changes that are coming as a result of the transportation budget passing.

The Fair School Funding Plans have also been released that details the state aid funding for 2019-2021. Below, you can see how much money each school district in HD 12 is estimated to be given in this formula.

Every 10 years, the results of the census determine how many seats each state gets in the U.S. House of Representatives. If there is an undercount, Ohio can lose 1-2 seats which diminishes our influence at the federal level.
