

Baked Ham Best Practices

Hams are available at the Maple Heights Food Pantry, while supplies last.

- Cook 10 minutes a pound at 325°F.
- Cook fat-side up in a roasting pan filled with about 1/2 inch of water covered tightly in foil for the bulk of the time.
- During the last 30 minutes, remove the foil, crank the heat up to 425°F, brush with a simple glaze at least twice.

Let rest 20 minutes before carving.

If resources permit, you may receive 6 days of food for each person in your household per month.


