

Message from the Director of Human Services, Linda Vopat

Greetings Everyone,

This month, we begin a new feature in our Golden Maple Leaves Newsletter, A message from the Director. I will share thoughts and information concerning the Senior Center, Food Pantry, Mobile Market, City of Maple Heights, current happenings and, sometimes, things that are on my heart.

In this issue, I want to talk a little about Juneteenth National Independence Day. President Joe Biden signed the legislation in 2021 making Juneteenth a legal Federal holiday. It commemorates the day when enslaved Black Americans in Galveston, Texas were informed of their freedom. That was more than two months after the Civil War ended and more than two years after Abraham Lincoln issued the Emancipation Proclamation!

At the state level in 2023, approximately 25 states, including Ohio, legally recognize Juneteenth as a state holiday and a few others are considering legislation to make it an official state holiday. Every state, at some point at least, has passed resolutions designating Juneteenth as a day of observance.

Some have asked, "Why should we celebrate July 4th. and Juneteenth? "I say we celebrate both." In my opinion, the 4th of July is about freedom and liberty. But how can we celebrate freedom when slavery still legally existed in our country. Juneteenth celebrates the emancipation of all people of the United States of America. Both holidays should be commemorated because they are important moments in our shared history.

It is my hope that this year, Juneteenth will call us to reflect on the true meaning of freedom to all Americans, particularly in respect to African Americans, as well as the entire world.

Learn to Play BUNCO!



It enhances your muscle tone, reflexes, hand-to-eye coordination, and endurance. The game is played with a beach ball and a five foot high net. Rules are similar to regular volleyball except "cheeks on the chair!"



It's played inside, players sit on chairs and the ball is a beach ball. Players can hit the
