Fiscal Recovery

David Yost State Auditor

- Income Tax and Property Tax Collection has increased more than 5% and is estimated to increase to over 8% in 2018.
- > The debt reduction achieved during the recovery has been >\$2,500,000
- We continue to adhere to the plan presented by the Maple Heights Financial Planning and Supervision Commission monitored by State Auditor Dave Yost's office; reducing debt and increasing revenue.
- We hope to be released from fiscal emergency by year-end 2018!



### Juvenile Diversion Program

- Goal: Our CDP program focuses on establishing confidence, academic & professional success, accountability, and leadership skills within all our students.
- Curriculum: Professional Etiquette 101, Job Placement, Public Speaking, College Application Procedures, Conflict Resolution Skills, Career Planning, Resume Building, & More.
- ▶ Data: As of March 14, 2018, our program has serviced over 113 students/juveniles within the City of Maple Heights.
- Of those 113 students/juveniles, 104 have successfully completed the program and/or has not subsequently been in trouble with the law.

## Mayor Blackwell Accepts Small Business Partnership Performance Grant



Mayor Blackwell accepts a ceremonial check from County Executive, Armond Budish and Chief Economic Development and Business Officer, Ted Carter. Mayor Blackwell and three other communities were awarded a \$150,000 small business performance grant from Cuyahoga County.

This performance grant is a public private partnership between the City of Maple Heights, Cuyahoga County and the Small Business Administration.

The Maple Heights Small Business Partnership Program provides qualifying small businesses with a 15% performance grant which will supplement their own equity contribution of 10% to a project. Upon completion of the project, 15% of the project cost is forgiven, if requirements are met.



### Maple Heights Economic Development

The Cleveland Foundation Board of Directors awarded a Grant to Study the Effects of the Foreclosure Crisis



The Cleveland Foundation board of directors awarded a \$197,540 grant in 2017 to study the effects of the foreclosure crisis on five of Cleveland's inner ring suburban communities and to strategize potential housing market recovery solutions.

The Western Reserve Land Conservancy was contracted to complete a property inventory of five communities – Euclid, Garfield Heights, Maple Heights, South Euclid, and Warrensville Heights – and analysis of housing marketing trends. The city also contracted with Dynamo Metrics to create a web-based mapping and decision-support tool to help the cities explore property survey data with respect to indicators of neighborhood health and economic activity, including data points provided by Northeast Ohio Community and Neighborhood Data for Organizing (NEO CANDO) and the Census Bureau. 56,346 parcels were inventoried.

I am pleased to share that Save-A-Lot in the Majetown-Shopping Center enovation is moving along very well and they are planning to open their doors in early April. McDonaids on Northfeld Road news it is consistent in February Mc Chicken's reopening in a new facility one Warrenoville Road is in May, and a new Family Dollands Sories opening all Rockide's & Dunham Roads in carly February. There are some large manufacturing developments as well, but the details are not verificat.

in the area of real estate, we sold more than 300 homes in 2017 and anticipate seeing our increasing housing values reflected on the Count's 2018 Property Reappraisal.

in an important effort to increase homeownership in our city, the City of Maple Heights has partnered with Slavic Village Development to rehabilitate vacant homes.

The Maple Heights Homosownership (MHHOP) Program is an initiative that will make vacart and distressed homes in Magle Heights available for purchase by both owner-occupants and developers, bringing investment to the city, stabilizing the local husuing market and providing an atterdable DIV home purchase option. The innovative way project is made possible through a perimership between the City of Maple Heights, Slavic Village Development and the Cuyahoga County Land Bark.

It is the first collaboration of its kind between a Cleveland community development corporation and a local suburb. But on a more disturbing note, the City of Maglo Heights has close to 600 Single Family Homes that are certified tax delinquent for more than \$2.000 per home, which is a little none 55 million perfect taxes.

**Opportunity Funds** 



The Ohio Development Services Agency recently passed a federal tax bill that allowed states to identify up to 25% of low-income, high-poverty census tracts to the U.S. Treasury, for a final determination of "Opportunity Zones". These areas will be eligible for "Opportunity Funds" to invest in economic development to receive a 10-year federal tax break. The Southgate Shopping Center is a recommended census tract for this tax incentive.

Homeowner Incentive Program - Maple Heights 100% Escrow Waiver

The City of Maple Heights is continuing an Owner Occupied Homeowner Incentive Program for the period of January 2, 2018 through December 31, 2018 to promote and encourage individuals to purchase and renovate residential properties by waiving 100% of the escrow requirement to correct violations, resulting from the point of sale inspection, so long as the purchaser actually occupies the property.




### inSite Advisory Group LLC





### Things you can do if you are behind on paying your property taxes:



- Call the Cuyahoga County Treasurer's Office at 216-443-7400. You can ask to be put on a payment plan to bring the taxes current. You can also take advantage of Easy Pay to make monthly payments on your current taxes to make it easier to pay. You may also be entitled to certain programs like Homestead Exemption that could reduce the amount of taxes you have to pay going forward. County staff can help you determine if you are getting all the assistance you are entitled to.
- What happens if I don't pay? If you don't pay, penalties and interest are added to what you owe. A lien for the amount you own can be sold to a third party, who will attempt to collect the debt. If a tax lien is sold, an additional 18% interest will be added to what you owe in addition to legal fees. If you can't pay the debt in a fairly short amount of time, the third party will foreclose on your home. In addition to a tax lien buyer, the County can also foreclose on you, if you don't pay your taxes. Sometimes people lose their homes over a fairly small delinquent tax balance. Do not assume that action will not be taken until your delinquent balance is very high— that is not the case. Residents have lost their homes for delinquent balances under \$5.000.
- What ever you do, don't ignore the situation even if your finances are limited. The County will work with you to help resolve the situation. No one wants to see you lose your home.
- The City of Maple Heights is owed over \$10 million in delinquent property taxes.

With your help the City of Maple Heights will be out of fiscal emergency!



### The City still faces several challenges:

- Delinquent property tax collection; the city currently has a real estate tax delinquency in the amount of \$10 million
- Additional staffing is needed on our safety forces, police and fire, and in the Service Department
- Continue to increase city revenues, income tax, property tax and secure grants
